Letter from Board Co-Chair

What an immense honour it is to look back and reflect on a milestone year at LGBT YouthLine. This year, we celebrated our 30th year of operations! We're proud to have held onto the scrappy grassroots spirit that shaped our beginnings back in 1994, and to still be standing proud three decades later providing peer support and resources to queer and trans youth across Ontario. The work we do has always been, and continues to be, a testament to the dedication and resilience of our staff, volunteers, and the community at large.

To mark our 30th birthday, we embarked on our 'Dialing In' series of panels across the province, with stops in London, Sudbury, Toronto, and Ottawa! These intergenerational conversations were a celebration of the ways our community has evolved and thrived over the years and the role YouthLine has played along the way.

With our peer support helpline always remaining at the heart of what we do, we also expanded our advocacy work this year. We hosted virtual teach-ins with community partners to inspire and teach youth, launched a letter-writing campaign for student rights, and continued building on our decades of experience working for and with 2SLGBTGQ+ youth. We also had the honour of speaking at the House of Commons about what queer youth have been telling us as part of a study on Hate Motivated Violence Targeting the 2SLGBTQI+ Community.

Our 30th year saw the completion of a new strategic plan that will help guide YouthLine into our next chapter, with an emphasis on our values and affirming that youth know their own experiences best and are the best people to make choices that are right for them. In 2024, we also launched a new website to make our services more accessible and user-friendly.

Of course, it wouldn't be a celebration without getting to visit our community across the province on our annual pride tour — maybe you saw our birthday balloons at Toronto's Trans March? From stories of HelpLine shifts of the past to connecting with our earliest volunteers and their children, every conversation was a reminder of the power of connection and the bonds that we collectively share through YouthLine.

We are so grateful for thirty years of community support – whether that's through giving your time or money, your support of our advocacy work, spreading the word about our services, or by sharing and reflecting on your memories of your time at YouthLine. Because of you, we know that LGBT YouthLine will continue to show up for 2SLGBTQ+ youth as long as we're needed!

30 years of Peer Support: For Youth, By Youth

For 30 years, YouthLine volunteers have been at the heart of our work, supporting their peers and shaping the impact of our HelpLine. Through a 12-week training program and close teamwork, volunteers gain confidence, skills, and lasting connections while offering care to 2SLGBTQ+ youth across Ontario.

In November 2024, many youth reached out with heightened anxiety and fear about the current political climate, including concerns about safety, rights, and access to care. In the face of this, our HelpLine has been a vital source of support and connection.



*Black, Indigenous, People of Colour **Includes Trans, Non-Binary, Gender Non-Conforming, Genderfluid, and Questioning youth





Youth We Connected With




Demographics of Youth Contacting Us

Training and Online Learning

In 2024-2025, 17 volunteers completed our 12-week peer support training.

After a couple of years focusing on sustainability, we have been able to stabilize our training cycle to once a year. This has also allowed us to dedicate more focused time on our trainees.

Advocacy

LGBT YouthLine has always engaged in advocacy as a core part of our work, from protests to public education campaigns. In 2024, we were fortunate to welcome our first Advocacy Specialist who strengthened our capacity to support 2SLGBTQ+ youth voices and expand YouthLine's advocacy presence across Ontario.

Advocacy Campaign Highlight:

Write for Student Rights

In July 2024, YouthLine launched the Write for Student Rights campaign, a letter-writing campaign focused on school safety and inclusion for 2SLGBTQ+ youth in Ontario.

Community members sent letters to their elected officials, including Premier Doug Ford and Minister of Education Jill Dunlop, and pledged to advocate on behalf of 2SLGBTQ+ youth and speak out against harmful legislation.

By the end of the campaign, 210 letters were sent and 54 people signed the pledge for inclusive schools. We want to thank all community members who sent a letter, took the pledge, and attended our Day of Action!

Special thank you to Queer Momentum for lending YouthLine letterwriting software and assisting in outreach for the campaign!



Teach-Ins

We launched a virtual teach-in series focused on advocacy, with two sessions held in 2024-2025 that taught the fundamentals of advocacy and created space for learning and discussion related to race, gender, and sexuality:

March 2025: Intro to Pinkwashing with Queers 4 Palestine



Dialing In: An Intergenerational Panel Series Celebrating 30 Years of Community Connections

To celebrate our 30th anniversary, LGBT YouthLine hosted a series of panels in Toronto, Ottawa, London, and Sudbury in collaboration with local 2SLGBTQ+ partners and communities. These panels brought together volunteers, board members, alumni, and staff to share stories about YouthLine's impact and their personal journeys.

A huge thank you to our panelists, photographers, caterers, ASL interpreters, venue partners, and volunteers for making our 30th anniversary panel series a success—together, we welcomed 200 community members across Toronto, Ottawa, London, and Sudbury.






Introducing Our 2024-2027 Strategic Plan


We welcomed our 30th year with a fresh new strategic plan, guiding our direction and priorities for the next three years:
